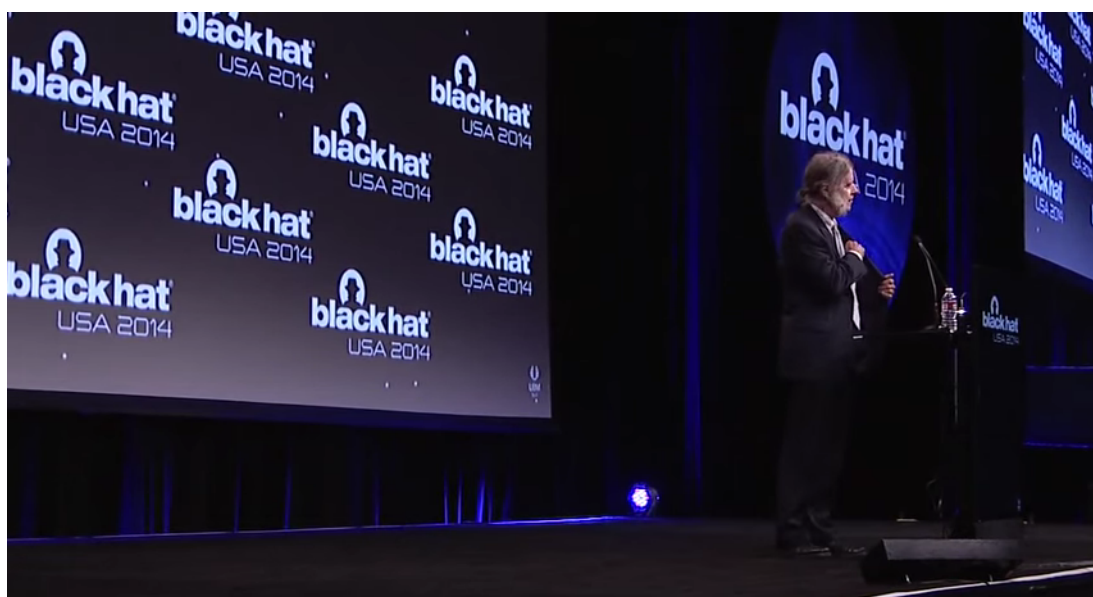


Black Hat 2014: Open Source Could Solve Medical Device Security
